- Elijah was accused of troubling Israel and her people by the king.
- But Elijah wanted to prove the king wrong that it's him who have troubled Israel by allowing apostasy.
- He wanted him to call all the people and the prophets of Baal at mount Carmel to prove who is the true God by offering sacrifice.
- He gave condition that the God who will answer by fire will be the true God of Israel.

- The God of Elijah proved to be the true God by answering with fire but the Baal could not respond in the presence of 450 prophets.
  - They were all put to the sword by Elijah.
