Section A (40 marks)

- 1. Definition
 - i) Tragedy: a type of drama which deals with serious actions and always a hero leads into danger.
 - ii) Epic: A long poem that deals with the actions of great men and women or the history of nations
 - iii) Sonnet: a fourteen-verse poem
 - iv) Alliteration: the use of the same sound at the beginning of consecutive words in a line.
 - v) Refrain: refers to a word or line that is repeated at the end of each stanza
