 - (a) Briefly explain Zacchaeus status and the way he attained it.
 - (b) Why did Zacchaeus climb the sycamore tree?
 - (c) What did Jesus say to Zacchaeus when he saw him up the tree?
 - (d) How did Zacchaeus react?
 - (e) What non-Christian today can learn from the visit of Jesus to Zacchaeus house?
2. Act 1:15-26 is about election where Matthias was chosen to replace Judas Iscariot
 - (a) Briefly tell who Judas was
 - (b) Provide **three** qualifications for the one to replace Judas and give the relevance of such qualities today
3. With reference to 1st Thessalonians book
 - (a) What is the main theme of the letter?
 - (b) Write **three** reasons why Paul wrote that letter
4. In the letter of Galatians Paul makes a sharp contrast between the work of the flesh and the fruits of the Holy Spirit
 - (a) What do you understand by the fruits of the Holy Spirit
 - (b) Draw a labeled diagram of an apple to represent the fruits of the Holy Spirit
 - (c) Which attribute of the fruit of the Holy Spirit is greatest of all Christians virtues. justify your answer
5. Explain good leadership behaviours that can be obtained from Jesus attitude toward leadership recorded in Mark 10: 35-35
6. It is said that Jesus sent his 12 disciples in pairs for the mission, instructing them to be wise as serpents and innocent doves (Matt 10:5-10)
 - (a) Why did Jesus send the 12 disciples for the mission?
 - (b) Why did Jesus send them in pairs although individually they could have reached remote areas of the country?
 - (c) The disciples were given authority over all things explain about them
 - (d) What did Jesus mean when he told his disciples to be wise as serpents and innocent as doves?

 - (b) By giving **two** points analyze the quotation in view of the cross as the means of salvation to all believers.
