Examples;

1. From : **Three Suitors: One Husband** by Guillaume Oyono Mbia, one should pick **Juliette** and present as follows:

- ii) *Juliette advocated the rights of free expression when she spoke in front of men.*
- iii) *Juliette was against forced marriage as she refused the family to choose her a suitor*
- iv) *She represents young generation who go against the outdated traditional customs*
- v) *She is courageous and liberal*

2. From : **The Lion and the Jewel** by Wole Soyinka, one should pick **Lakunle** and present as follows:

- i) He is enamored with ideas of progress as he fought the irresponsible Baroka.

3. SPARED by S.N. Ndunguru in which

- i) Chris Mayes's betrayal to the government of Tanzania led to exploitation of minerals that enriched investors not Tanzania.
- ii) Oswald Mwangi's ignorance on how the Wickman's operated led to him involved in unbeneficial deals to Tanzania.
- iii) Peter Msokonde's ignorance of rights and betrayal to the government led him to reallocate the planned land to friends.

4. WEEP NOT CHILD by Ngugi wa Thiong'o in which;

- i) Jacobo betrayed his fellow Africans in the fight for their land which led to continuous colonisation.
- ii) The ignorance of the MAU MAU fighters on proper led to loss of life and African man power which led to underdevelopment.
- iii) Jacobo's betrayal and collaboration with Mr. Howland led to intensive exploitation in Africa.

5. PASSED LIKE A SHADOW by B. Mapalala.

- ii) Adyeri betrayed the government by misusing the funds allocated for school project on his personal use.
- iii) Adyeri/Amoti/David/David's father/ Vicky and all characters who died of HIV/AIDS were ignorant of the disease that caused loss of man power.
